

The number of international graduate students increased 14% between 2005 and 2010 and 25% between 2010 and 2015


HISTORICAL ENROLLMENT PROPORTION OF TOTAL

HISTORICAL ENROLLMENT GENDER PROPORTIONS









ENROLLMENT TREND ASIA IS THE LARGEST REGIONAL CONTRIBUTOR




The number of international graduate students from **China** has **more than doubled** since 2005



CHANGING ENROLLMENT

From 2016 to 2017 international graduate student enrollment declined for the first time since 2008-2009 recession



H1-B VISA CHANGES AFFECTS INDIAN ENROLLMENTS



- Trump administration tightened H1-B visa requirements
- Dramatic decrease from India
 - Decreased enrollment in science and engineering programs
 - Related to H1-B Visa Changes

While international graduate student enrollment declined overall in 2017, the enrollment at individual schools is **influenced by institutional prestige**






AVAILABILITY OF UNIVERSITY HOUSING MORE IMPORTANT TO INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS


CURRENT HOUSING MORE LIKELY TO LIVE IN UNIVERSITY HOUSING






- Lack of familiar foods can add to homesickness

LIVING SITUATION MOST INTERNATIONAL GRADS HAVE 1+ ROOMMATES




- Cost and acculturation are both factors


Preferences differ by international status (% important)

Neighborhood safety is a universal concern, but of particular importance to international graduate students


CAR OWNERSHIP INTERNATIONAL GRADS LESS LIKELY TO OWN CAR

 - How does this add to the broader campus climate?


