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SUMMARY NOTES

OVERALL POPULATION CHANGE FROM 2015 TO 2017


- The overall population of Massachusetts has remained stable (1% growth). Berkshire is the only county with a decline in population, but it is limited to -1%. From 2016 to 2017, Suffolk and Nantucket had the largest growth (2%).
- Data suggest a modest downward trend from 2015 to 2017 in the number of 15 to 19 year olds, and a modest upward trend of 20 to 24 year olds.

STUDENT POPULATION FALL 2018

- Over 60% of full-time undergraduate students at the nine State Universities live in Worcester, Middlesex, Plymouth and Essex counties.
- In Fall 2018, Boston and Worcester are the cities with the highest representation for the total nine State Universities system, each with approximately 1,300 students.

STUDENT POPULATION CHANGE FALL 2016 TO FALL 2018


- From Fall 2016 to Fall 2018, the population of full-time in-state undergraduate students at the nine State Universities declined by 1,309 students, a difference of -4.2%.
- Worcester county was the only substantial growth area (over 100 students) for student population at the nine State Universities.
- Each State University has a strong core of full-time undergraduate enrollment from its own county, and often, but not always, from adjacent counties.
- Boston and Worcester, the two top feeder cities in the state, are not always a top feeder for each school. Boston is included as a top-five feeder to five of the State Universities. Worcester is a top-ten feeder to five of the State Universities.
- Universities with counties of enrollment with a growth of 50 students or more: Bridgewater State (Bristol, Plymouth); Fitchburg State (Worcester); MMA (Norfolk); Worcester State (Worcester).
- Universities with counties of enrollment with a decline of 50 students or more: Bridgewater State (Essex, Middlesex); Fitchburg State (Middlesex, Worcester); Framingham State (Essex, Middlesex, Worcester); MCLA (Berkshire); Salem State (Essex, Middlesex, Suffolk); Westfield State (Berkshire, Hampden, Middlesex, Worcester).

Between 2015 and 2017, Massachusetts has grown 1% in overall population. Berkshire was the only county with a declining population for both years. Population remained relatively stable for both years and for all counties. From 2016 to 2017, Nantucket and Suffolk had the largest overall growth with a 2% increase.

Data not shown in table suggest a modest downward trend from 2015 to 2017 in the number of 15 to 19 year olds, and a modest upward trend of 20 to 24 year olds.







Overall, the population of full-time in-state undergraduate students has declined by 1,309 (-4.2%) students, from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

The counties with the largest overall change in full-time undergraduate enrollment are Middlesex (-488), Berkshire (-323), Essex (-317) and Hampden (-200).

The only county with a substantial growth in number of students is Worcester, which increased by 107 students.

CHANGE OF FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATES, 2016 TO 2018 Change by County,

Change by County, Nine State Universities

Percentage change can be misleading when a country has a small number of students. For example, Nantucket had a growth of 54.5% from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018, but only provides a small number of students to the nine State Universities.

By contrast, Berkshire (-48%), Essex (-7.9%), Hampden (-9.1%), and Middlesex (-9.2%) had a decline of over 100 students.

Worcester (1.7%) is the only county with a growth of over 100 students. It is also the county with the highest representation of students in the state. In addition, it is one of the counties with a low percentage change in student population between Fall 2016 and Fall 2018.





Overall, the BSU population of full-time in-state students has increased slightly by 38 students (0.5%), from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Although most counties show small growth in BSU population, both Essex (-52) and Middlesex (-85) show a substantial decline in enrollment.

Plymouth and Bristol provide more than half of undergraduate students for BSU and are also the counties with the largest BSU population growth between 2016 and 2018.












Overall, the FSU population of full-time instate students has declined by 113 (-3.6%) students, from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Middlesex (-65) and Norfolk (-51) lost the most students, but almost all other counties had declining student populations as well.

Worcester county, provider of 46% of all FSU students, is the only growth area and increased by 69 students. Nantucket remained stable with 1 extra student.














Overall, the Framingham State population of full-time in-state students has declined by 307 (-8.6%) students, from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Barnstable, Dukes and Nantucket have remained stable, while Suffolk is the only growth area (29).

Middlesex (-78) and Worcester (-74) account together for 57% of the student population, but also declined the most between Fall 2016 and Fall 2018.














Overall, the MassArt population of full-time in-state undergraduate students has increased 116 students (10.9%), from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Although Middlesex has the largest MassArt population, Suffolk (35) and Worcester (36) are the largest growth areas.

Norfolk, Essex, and Plymouth also had moderate growth, while most other counties stayed more or less stable (-1 to 9).














Overall, the MCLA population of full-time in-state undergraduate students declined by 210 (-23.4%), from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

This decline in student population is mostly due to a large fall in population in Berkshire County (-183).

Franklin is the only county with a substantial growth of MCLA students.














Overall, the MMA population of full-time in-state undergraduate students has increased by 33 (2.6%) students, from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Most counties remained relatively stable. Suffolk (11) and Plymouth (16) had a moderate growth and Norfolk is the largest growth area, increasing by 51 students.

Barnstable had a substantial decline (-41) in undergraduate student population.







Overall, the Salem State population of full-time in-state undergraduate students declined by 433 (-7.9%), from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Most counties had a loss in undergraduate student population. Middlesex and Essex account together for 71% of Salem State population, and also experienced the most losses.

The only growth areas are Barnstable (5) and Worcester (17).

WESTFIELD STATE UNIVERSITY STUDENT POPULATION CHANGE 2016 TO 2018





Overall, the Westfield State population of full-time in-state undergraduate students has declined by 517 (-11.3%), from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.

Both Hampden (-128) and Middlesex (-131) showed a serious decline in student population. There were no significant increases in population in any county.







Overall, the Worcester State population of full-time in-state undergraduate students increased by 98 (2.6%), from Fall 2016 to Fall 2018.


Worcester is the largest provider of students for Worcester State University, and also shows the biggest increase, 102 students.


Most counties to the east of Worcester State show a moderate growth. On the contrary, most counties to the west show declines in student population.


